ICademy Global

Exploring Global Citizenship Through The Capstone Travel Program

iCademy Global, a cyber charter school based in Zeeland, Michigan, offers its students an exceptional blend of online education and real-world experiences through its innovative Capstone Travel Program. Open to students across the state, this program is more than just an educational journey; it's an experience that equips young learners with a deeper understanding of global issues and the importance of being responsible global citizens.

The Capstone Travel Program connects to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs), providing students with a framework to explore and engage with critical global challenges. Last year, the focus was on UNSDG 6: ensuring access to clean water and sanitation for all. This theme guided the program's educational content and was paired with a series of enriching travel experiences for students from kindergarten through high school.

For elementary students, the program brought learning to life with trips to local natural sites such as Silver Lake Sand Dunes and Hoffmaster State Park and included a tour of Country Dairy. These trips provided hands-on opportunities to explore the importance of natural resources and sustainability in their own communities. Meanwhile, middle school students ventured further afield to Southern Virginia, where they had the unique experience of spending a night aboard the battleship Wisconsin, along with tours of Williamsburg, Jamestown, and Yorktown deepening their understanding of history, geography, and the significance of water in shaping civilizations.

High school students embarked on a more extensive journey to Utah and Arizona, where they explored the Grand Canyon, Zion, Snow Canyon, the engineering marvel of the Hoover Dam, and the cultural heritage of the Hualapai Reservation. These trips were not only about witnessing these iconic landmarks but also involved active participation in service projects, such as volunteering with Feed My Starving Children, emphasizing the importance of stewardship and community service.

iCademy Global is deeply committed to ensuring that all students, regardless of their financial background, can participate in these impactful experiences. The school allocates resources to reduce and, in many cases, negate travel costs, making these opportunities accessible to all students.



ICademy Global Continued

As the new school year unfolds, iCademy Global shifts its focus to UNSDG 2: ending hunger, achieving food security, and promoting sustainable agriculture. This year's Capstone Travel Program promises to be just as impactful, with planned trips to Kentucky, where students will engage with local food challenges, and an international trip to Germany, offering a cross-cultural perspective on sustainable food systems.

Through the Capstone Travel Program, iCademy Global continues to foster a generation of informed, empathetic, and proactive global citizens. The program is a testament to the school's commitment to combining academic excellence with real-world experience, preparing students to make meaningful contributions to the world around them.
